How to Register

All students must turn in, or have on file, a completed E-13 Participant Information and Authorization form to register for class. Once completed, E-13 forms are good for one school year. Though classes are held at the school, all paper work must be turned in to Montlake Community Center, where you can receive more information about classes, registration, and scholarships.

FIRST CHOICE

Stop by your local community center to register for programs and meet the staff. Staff welcomes face-to-face interaction! Please note hours of operation as they vary across community centers.

SECOND CHOICE

THIRD CHOICE

Call your local community center during our hours of operation at the phone number listed above, or at: seattle.gov/parks/centers.asp. All staff can assist you with registration during operating hours.

An additional \$5 insurance fee will be required when registering for all gymnastics, tumbling, or circus arts classes offered through Seattle Parks and Recreation. This non-refundable fee covers a child's participation in all gymnastics, tumbling, or circus arts classes for one year from the date of purchase. Please contact your local community center to purchase this insurance. **Note:** This insurance will only be utilized if expenses exceed your primary insurance coverage.

^{*}There are no after school classes on holidays, no school days, or early dismissal days at the Elementary School. These "No Class" days are figured into the price of each class.

What You Need to Know

Registration and Payments:

NEW INFORMATION, PLEASE READ CAREFULLY

Seattle Parks and Recreation is launching a new Registration Software on November 27, registration for Winter Enrichment opens Dec 4.

You may already be in the new system. If you have a current pass, scholarship, or staff have already entered your information. To check, follow these steps:

- Step 1: Go to the www.seattle.gov/parks and click on Sign Up for Classes and Programs
- Step 2: Click on 'Sign In'.
- Step 3: Click on 'Forgot Password' and enter your email address to have your login information sent to you.

If you do not already have an account, follow the steps below to set up an account:

- Step 1: Go to the www.seattle.gov/parks and click on Sign Up for Classes and Programs
- Step 2: Click on 'Create Account'.
- Step 3: Complete your information!

If you have any questions about creating a new account, please reach out to your local Community Center directly. Once you have an account, you may call Montlake Community Center, stop by, or register and pay online. If you register online, please email the community center coordinator who your child's classroom teacher is and where your child will be going after class. Registration is open for all classes until the day prior to the start of class. Remember: All students need a Participant Information and Authorization E-13 form prior to participating in any after-school classes.

Scholarship:

To apply for a scholarship, complete and return a scholarship application to the community center. Applications can be found in the TOPS K-8 main office, Montlake CC, or can be downloaded at <a href="bit:blue-b

Refund Policy:

It is the policy of Seattle Parks and Recreation and the Associated Recreation Council that:

- Anyone who registers for a class that is cancelled for any reason will receive a full refund.
- DROPPING A PROGRAM BEFORE THE SECOND SESSION: A participant may be issued a refund if he/she withdraws from a program, and notifies the program coordinator, prior to the second class

session. The facility will retain the pro-rated class fee plus a service charge of \$5 or 10% of the fee, whichever is greater.

- DROPPING A PROGRAM AFTER THE SECOND SESSION: If a participant withdraws from a program after the second session of a series, no refund will be given.
- CANCELLATION OF ONE SESSION: In the event of an unplanned cancellation of a single session, that class will be rescheduled, and If it cannot be rescheduled, the participant will receive a refund.

OH NO! My class got cancelled!

Most classes require a minimum of 6 participants in order to be financially sustainable. We do our best to avoid cancelling classes. However, classes that do not meet minimum enrollment requirement are cancelled prior to their start date. We do prorate class fees to reflect late registration for classes that meet minimum enrollment requirement prior to their start dates.

PLEASE REGISTER EARLY!

Snack and Clothing:

The After School Enrichment Program will provide a snack for each student. Please send your children with clothing appropriate for their classes.

Behavior:

We have the expectation of respect for teachers/ instructors and good behavior during classes. Students are expected to maintain the same behavioral standards that they would during the formal school day. If an instructor determines this is not the case the following steps will be taken:

- At the first incident, the Program Administrator will contact parents/guardians regarding student behavior.
- The student will be given one trial class to improve.
- If the disruptive behavior continues, the student will be removed from class.

The program is unable to issue a refund if the student is removed from a class due to a behavioral issue. Please discuss enrollment with your child to be sure they want to attend an after school class.

Picking up Your Child:

Your child must be picked up on time. Our program does not provide childcare after class is over and the playground is not supervised at that time. If your child is picked up late, you will be charged \$1/minute for every minute past your pick up time that you are late. Please call the **Program Administrator** if you are going to be late. Your student can only be picked up by persons listed on the E-13 form.

What You Need to Know Continued

Absences/Changes:

Please contact the **Program Administrator** as soon as possible with any of the following:

- 1. Your student will not be attending class (but was at school).
- 2. Your student was absent from school and will not be attending the After School Program.

Questions/Concerns:

Once a class has begun, if you have any issues or concerns regarding a class, please contact the **Program Administrator**, or email the **Community Center Coordinator**. The **Program Administrator** will be on-site and available during program hours all quarter.

Winter 2019 Class Descriptions A-Z

App Inventor

Students build games and solve real-world problems with App Inventor, a visual drag and drop programming language developed by Google.

Through creating mobile apps like Finger Paint and Whack-a-Mole, students explore the computer science concepts such as conditional statements, modeling with mathematical equations and event handling. Taught by Computing Kids.

American Sign Language

Our goal is not to just teach kids vocabulary, but cultural sensitivity and the importance of making communication accessible to people of all abilities. We cover basic grammar, various storytelling styles, ASL games, cultural history and etiquette.

Beginning French

Is your child interested in learning French? Alliance Francaise de Seattle offers an opportunity to learn the French language and culture. Class is driven by age-appropriate curriculum and instructors that are attentive to your child's skill level.

Beginning Guitar

Join us for a beginner's guitar class with Ms. Natalie where we'll learn basic chords in "home position." Our goal will be to play multiple songs in full by end of the session. Players from previous sessions are welcome. Guitar provided, but students can bring their own.

Carpentry

Kids Carpentry is a hands-on toy building class designed to teach practical woodworking skills with an emphasis on the safe use of tools. Kids will develop a repertoire of practical skills that last a lifetime and construct fun projects that they will take home!

Chess Club

This class will improve your child's problem-solving skills, train their memory and teach them to think and plan ahead. They will learn chess tactics and solve puzzles while playing competitive and just-forfun games! Workbooks and other teaching materials provided.

Chorus

This is an opportunity for students to sing with the classically trained singer and TOPS music teacher, Natalie Ingrisano. Younger students can join but need to call Montlake at (206) 684-4736.

Cooking Around the World with Seattle Cusina

Join Seattle Cusina for exciting cooking lessons from around the world! Each week we will whip up a recipe from across the globe — from sushi to Indian parathas. Students will develop practical skills to cook at home and knowledge about nutritional eating. Tuesdays for K-3 and Thursdays 3-5 grade.

Crafting and Cardmaking

Recycling has never been so fun! Turn clean recyclables into beautiful works of art! Students learn just how satisfying it can feel to repurpose unwanted materials into useful items for the home in this DIY, environmentally friendly, crafting class.

Crafting for Community

Crafts for Community: learn how to crochet with Ms. Natalie! Our goal will be to make 1-2 hats or scarves per person to donate to Seattle's homeless at the end of the class session. Already experienced at crocheting? Come help us--let's see how many things we can make to donate and keep our city warm!

DASSdance

Does your child like to show their moves on the dance floor? Here's their chance! This class will introduce jazz, ballet and Hip Hop styles in a fun inclusive way. Get ready for an upbeat class that encourages self-expression through movement, music, and rhythm.

Discover Art

Art is about discovery! Students use a variety of artistic mediums to learn to express themselves creatively and confidently in this supportive, non-competitive class. The structured format ensures skill development as they journey down the road of self-discovery through creative expression.

Dungeons and Dragons (5th edition)

You've joined the Dungeons and Dragons class armed with nothing but a pencil, notebook and a set of shiny dice. Come join in the adventure!

Gym Games

Sprout ball, battleship and color squad are a few of the games students will play to learn the importance of team work while getting the benefit of physical activity!

The Hobbit with Stone Soup Theatre

Come along on the exciting and surprising quest of Bilbo Baggins as he meets strange and mysterious characters on his journey. Elves, trolls, wargs, and a fiery-tempered dragon are part of this grand storytelling drama. Concludes with a performance.

Intermediate Coding

Students design their own world and bring it to life with Scratch, a visual drag and drop program. Students learn the foundations of programming including conditional statements, variables and message handling. Taught by Computing Kids.

Jewelry Making

Born to bling! This fun DIY class will teach students the basics of making simple earrings, stringing beads for bracelets and necklaces, making pendants, and crimping beads to finish off their custom designs.

Knitting

This class will teach beginner knitting and crocheting techniques. Students will create fun while learning how to slip knot, knit and purl, and cast off. This class will build hand dexterity and a love for yarn crafting.

Legos Builds: Bricks4Kidz

Students will use motorized Lego kits to learn about scale and engineering. Join us on an adventurous Star Wars journey through space! Build a rocket to blast through the atmosphere into a realm that is truly out of this world. We'll build motorized models that represent spacecraft from our favorite movie in a galaxy far, far away. Taught by BEAM Experiences.

Magic: The Gathering

Magic the Gathering will help improve your child's math and logic skills through the strategic playing of cards with different abilities. New and experienced players welcome. Bring your own deck or we can provide you with one to use.

Minecrafting EDU

Use of an educational version of Minecraft will allow your child to create a networked world. Each week there is a new demonstration such as redstone, programmable turtles, or an interesting build. Exploration is encouraged and fostered depending on experience and interest.

Pinnacle Outdoors

Does your child have a passion for the outdoors? With a focus on hands-on learning, participants will conduct interactive experiments, make crafts, and go on field trips. Weather permitting, class will be outdoors.

Pokémon Trading Card Club

Your child will be able to play the game they love, with the supervision and assistance of experienced instructors. Players of all levels are welcome. We will have cards for beginners.

Pottery

This class gives students an opportunity to build clay crafting skills. Students will work with their hands, tools and the pottery wheel. Taught by Suzanne Wakefield, TOPS Art teacher. Ends 3/19

Reading Club

Jump into the world of literature with this brandnew club! 4th and 5th graders of all reading levels are invited to join the Global Reading Challenge. Younger readers will have a chance to develop their reading skills with age appropriate books and instructor assistance.

Recess/Homework Club

From 4:45-5:30 p.m., Mon, Tue, Wed, and Thu and 3:30-5 p.m. on Wed, students will tackle their homework. If beautiful outside, kids may go out to the playground with the instructor.

Robot U's RC Power Functions

Students learn advanced engineering concepts (torque, gearing, levers, etc.) building remote controlled vehicles and contraptions using various LEGO® motors and Technic® parts. This is NOT a free play activity, but a class with actual lessons (regardless of how fun and crazy it is).

Winter 2019 Class Descriptions A-Z

Science Adventures

Liquids, solids, and gas, surround us. In this class your child will get to do hands-on science experiments to learn about the matter around us! They'll see what happens to soda pop gas in a balloon and more.

Sewing

Students are invited to learn a skill they will use for a lifetime... sewing! This class will cover the basics and beyond. Beginning students will learn machine safety and basic sewing techniques, while more experienced students will expand on skills they already have.

ACTIVITY BUS

MONDAYS THROUGH THURSDAYS

TOPS has a (free) activity bus that leaves TOPS at 4:45 pm Mondays through Thursdays, starting in mid-October, for families living east or south of TOPS. First preference goes to middle school students, but if there is extra room, younger students are able to utilize the bus as well. Please submit the below form, complete with signature, to the TOPS office as soon as possible. It can take 1-2 weeks for transportation to process requests. Please make sure you have confirmation that your child/ren can ride the bus. Margo Robb, the TOPS Enrichment Program Coordinator, will be in touch with you about eligibility and details. For questions, email her at Margo.Robb@seattle.gov.

Please note that the bus covers a lot of territory and can take a long time. It can be challenging for younger riders.

This is the protocol that buses drivers follow for younger riders:

- Elementary age students are welcomed to ride. The same rules apply to ASAs (After School Activity Buses) as with to and from Transportation.
- K-12 general education students are allowed to get off the without someone there to meet them.
- Stop assignments would follow service standards K-5 grade students with stops not causing them to cross major or minor arterial streets.
 And 6-8 grade students able to cross at controlled intersections.
- If a student, of any age, is uncomfortable getting off the bus, the drivers are to keep them on the bus and contact their dispatcher. Our office
 would then be contacted and we would do our best to make contact with a parent or guardian to have them come meet their student.
- Boundaries for bussing are greater than what is used for "to and from" transportation, but anything outside the transportation zone will be
 decided on by the Transportation Office on a case-by-case basis.
