	Green Lake Small Craft Capital Campaign Presentation and Recommendation for Support Continued		Bill Keller thanked mike for great presentation, represents work we do together, 1 of many examples of all good things happening, look around room, encouraging, looked at \$75K, running close to zero run games, due to minimum wage impact & keeping fee structure reasonable, over year managed able to create a bit of a reserve, as of this morning have about 4 months reserve, 5.2 million, \$75,000 recommended over 3 years, to come from reserve not operation Frana inquired to history of supporting these requests Bill replied we navigated so many things over the years, w/ Mt. Baker worked w/ them, ARC didn't make contribution to overall campaign, but worked to get shared revenue of rentals, different sort of thing than Parks had ever done before, usually turnkey, currently working w/ Amy Yee Tennis Center, facility in need of repair, replacement, & expansion, trying to get in front of that, this would be first to come up w/ this level of funding, believe they make material difference in lives, largest teen program, like ARC, best kept secret, support recommendation, w/ condition, from reserve not operating Dave commented last year contributed to ARC, earmarked for Green Lake facility, does that hurt you Bill explained as 501c3, have restricted account for this such thing Vinita asked about specific donors from reserve to which Bill responded this would be first one Frana questioned upcoming events, would help match, as challenge, put on letter Mike answered everything put forward as match, done already once, at this stage, to launch website, could be confusing/who is ARC, trying to navigate, have to be careful w/ donors, scholarship needs Terry inquired about what handling percent fee is to which Bill responded it's 3% Terry stated 3% of 6 million, we're actually taking \$ in to cover cost, not a big deal, but it is Bill shared one thing, Alki AC, previously remodeled & expanded to have bigger lobby, about 110K in Capital money, in addition, approved remodel of kitchen another 25K, not uncharacteristic of us to do thing
