About the Equity & Priority Populations Index

As part of Seattle Parks and Recreation's <u>2020 Strategic Plan</u>, we set a goal to "improve equity and effectiveness across our community center system by redesigning our community center operations and programming." Related to this commitment, we developed the Equity and Priority Populations Index (EPPI), a tool using a variety of relevant indicators to identify the communities most in need of our services. To develop this tool, we:

- Identified the **core considerations** that should drive how we invest—for example, *prioritizing* service to regions impacted by racism and poverty.
- Selected **data indicators** that served as good measures of these core considerations—for example, looking at reports of *federal poverty rate* as a proxy for health disparities.
- Measured these indicators in the service areas of each community center—for example, the American Community Survey calculated the percent of households below the federal poverty rate; in the service areas of our community centers, this ranged from 6% at Alki to 21% at Rainier.
- Developed a **scoring system** for the indicators—for example, looking at the *percent of households below the federal poverty rate*, we assigned point values to the range, with the sites with the highest poverty rates receiving a 3, mid-level poverty rates receiving a 2, and lowest poverty rates receiving a 1.
- Created an Equity Prioritization based on adding up the scores for all indicators together for
 each site, resulting in a list of sites in Equity Priority 1 (scoring highest on the full index,
 indication the highest priority for our services), Equity Priority 2, and Equity Priority 3.

The table below describes the full set of core considerations and data indicators that make up the index, and the tables on the following page display the total score and equity prioritization of individual community centers.
