 All parents must SIGN OUT their student by 4:45 p.m., or 4 p.m. (Wed). Late fees will be assessed \$1 per minute.

\*There are no after school classes on holidays, no school days, or early dismissal days at the Elementary School. These "No Class" days are figured into the price of each class.

# **How to Register**

All students must turn in, or have on file, a completed E-13 Participant Information and Authorization form to register for class. Once completed, E-13 forms are good for one school year. Though classes are held at the school, all paper work must be turned in to Miller Community Center, where you can receive more information about classes, registration, and scholarships.

### **FIRST CHOICE**

Check out Seattle Parks and Recreation's new online registration software at bit.ly/spr\_registration\_account. Sign in or create an account if this is your first time registering for classes with the new software. Once you are logged in you can choose your programs and pay online.

### **SECOND CHOICE**

Find your local recreation center at: seattle.gov/parks/centers.asp and stop by to register for programs and meet the staff. Take a peek at the recreation center and the program space. Staff welcomes face-to-face interaction! Please note hours of operation, as they vary across recreation centers.

### **THIRD CHOICE**

Call your local recreation center during their hours of operation at the phone number listed at: seattle.gov/parks/centers.asp. All staff can assist you with registration during their operating hours listed on their home page linked from the above web address.

An additional \$5 insurance fee will be required when registering for all gymnastics, tumbling, or circus arts classes offered through Seattle Parks and Recreation. This non-refundable fee covers a child's participation in all gymnastics, tumbling, or circus arts classes for one year from the date of purchase. Please contact your local community center to purchase this insurance. **Note:** This insurance will only be utilized if expenses exceed your primary insurance coverage.

### What You Need to Know

### **Registration and Payments:**

Seattle Parks and Recreation launched new program Registration Software this winter.

If you do not already have an account, follow the steps below to set up an account:

Step 1: Go to the www.seattle.gov/parks and click on Sign Up for Classes and Programs

Step 2: Click on 'Create Account'.
Step 3: Complete your information!

If you have any questions about creating a new account, please reach out to your local Community Center directly. Once you have an account, you may call Miller Community Center, stop by, or register and pay online. If you register online, please email the community center coordinator who your child's classroom teacher is and where your child will be going after class. Registration is open for all classes until the day prior to the start of class. Remember: All students need a Participant Information and Authorization E-13 form prior to participating in any after-school classes.

### **Scholarship:**

To apply for a scholarship, complete and return a scholarship application to the community center. Applications can be found in the Stevens main office, Miller CC, or can be downloaded at <a href="bit:blu/sprscholarships">bit:blu/sprscholarships</a>. Scholarship award and co-payment will be determined based on income qualification and fund availability.

### **Refund Policy:**

It is the policy of Seattle Parks and Recreation and the Associated Recreation Council that:

- Anyone who registers for a class that is cancelled for any reason will receive a full refund.
- DROPPING A PROGRAM BEFORE THE SECOND SESSION: A participant may be issued a refund if he/ she withdraws from a program, and notifies the program coordinator, prior to the second class session. The facility will retain the pro-rated class fee plus a service charge of 10% of the fee.
- DROPPING A PROGRAM AFTER THE SECOND SESSION: If a participant withdraws from a program after the second session of a series, no refund will be given
- CANCELLATION OF ONE SESSION: In the event of an unplanned cancellation of a single session, that class will be rescheduled, and If it cannot be rescheduled, the participant will receive a refund.

### OH NO! My class got cancelled!

Most classes require a minimum of 6 participants in order to be financially sustainable. We do our best to avoid cancelling classes. However, classes that do not meet minimum enrollment requirement are cancelled prior to their start date. We do prorate class fees to reflect late registration for classes that meet minimum enrollment requirement prior to their start dates.

### PLEASE REGISTER EARLY!

### **Snack and Clothing:**

The After School Enrichment Program will provide a snack for each student. Please send your children with clothing appropriate for their classes.

### **Behavior:**

We have the expectation of respect for teachers/ instructors and good behavior during classes. Students are expected to maintain the same behavioral standards that they would during the formal school day. If an instructor determines this is not the case the following steps will be taken:

- At the first incident, the Program Administrator will contact parents/guardians regarding student behavior.
- The student will be given one trial class to improve.
- If the disruptive behavior continues, the student will be removed from class.

The program is unable to issue a refund if the student is removed from a class due to a behavioral issue. Please discuss enrollment with your child to be sure they want to attend an after school class.

### **Picking up Your Child:**

Your child must be picked up on time. Our program does not provide childcare after class is over and the playground is not supervised at that time. If your child is picked up late, you will be charged \$1/minute for every minute past your pick up time that you are late. Please call the **Program Administrator** if you are going to be late. Your student can only be picked up by persons listed on the E-13 form.

### Absences/Changes:

Please contact the **Program Administrator** as soon as possible with any of the following:

- 1. Your student will not be attending class (but was at school).
- 2. Your student was absent from school and will not be attending the After School Program.

### **Questions/Concerns:**

Once a class has begun, if you have any issues or concerns regarding a class, please contact the **Program Administrator**, or email the **Community Center Coordinator**. The **Program Administrator** will be onsite and available during program hours all quarter.

Inclement Weather and City Wide Emergencies: Please call our CHILD CARE/ENRICHMENT HOTLINE: 206-684-4203, This is a 24-hour line giving information about program closures due to extreme weather or emergencies. It is updated each day by 6 a.m. and as needed.

# **Spring 2019 Class Descriptions A-Z**

### **Art Club with Willow**

Draw, paint, craft, and collage bold and colorful creations with professional artist and storyteller Willow Heath! Each week your child will explore a different art theme, from nature painting, drawing animals, manga sketches, to abstract collage and clay. Students will have the chance to vote on which art lessons Willow will teach.

### Carpentry

Kids Carpentry is a hands-on toy building class designed to teach practical woodworking skills with an emphasis on the safe use of tools. Your child will develop a repertoire of practical skills that will last a lifetime and construct fun projects that they will take home! Program Provided by Kids Carpentry

### Cars of the Future

Gas cars have ruled the road for 100 years, but electric vehicles are the transportation of the future! This class will dive into the mechanics of electric motors and batteries and the evolution of transportation. Lessons are designed to engage students with hands-on building activities and opportunities to explore new technologies up close. Program provided by Drive Electric Washington in partnership with ARC.

### Choir 3-4

Students will have fun learning about music and singing together. This class was created to teach 3rd and 4th graders the basics of choir in preparation for Stevens Choir 5. The choir will perform at the end of the session.

### Eat Like an Italian

Learn to cook Italian cuisine! Each week students will prepare a Mediterranean recipe that highlights a particular technique or ingredient. By the end of this series, students will have the skills necessary to begin cooking Italian food at home! Class prices include a meal. Accommodations for dietary restrictions upon request.

### Flag Football

Down, set, hike! Students will learn the fundamentals of this American classic including how to throw, catch, and play each position on the field. This class is a safe environment for players of all skill levels.

### **Garden Science**

Does your child like to dig in the dirt? Students will learn to plant and seed a variety of local herbs and vegetables suited for Seattle's unique gardening climate. This hands on approach to gardening that will bring out your child's inner gardener. Program instructed by Urban Gardener Shanelle Donaldson.

### **Jewelry Making**

Create dazzling decorative adornments! Students explore color, patterns, textures, and shapes as they design and craft their own jewelry. Martials include store bought beads, handmade beads, and other creative objects. New projects added each session! Program instructed by Lori Bugaj

### **Messy Matter**

Liquids, solids, and gas, surround us. In this class your child will get to do hands-on science experiments to learn about the matter around us! They'll see what happens to soda pop gas in a balloon and more.

### **Obstacle Course Challenge**

With a little help from the instructor, students will design, create and complete fun obstacle courses. Your child will work with peers while being physically active and practicing their agility!

### **Paint Like Picasso**

Students will paint using different mediums while learning about cubism from Picasso, pointillism from Seurat, action painting from Pollock and more. Leave this class with some masterpieces of your own!

### **Parkour**

Parkour is a fun, acrobatic, activity that builds physical and mental confidence by seeking challenge through overcoming obstacles in the environment. Classes include games as well as instruction in preparation, safe progression, intelligent decision-making, and longevity. # **Spring 2019 Class Descriptions A-Z**

### Slime Time!

Does your child love all things slime? If so, this is the class for them! Each week students will make a different type of slime to take home and play with.

Spanish

This class integrates play, music, movement, and art to engage your child and connect the foreign sounds and words to everyday concepts and activities. We encourage you to reinforce the learning at home with music, movies, or books in the language.

### **Sports Sampler**

Does your child love sports? They will improve their skills in a variety of team sports including kickball, soccer, basketball, ultimate frisbee, and more! Each class will cover a different sport with unique skills and techniques that stress the importance of teamwork, strategies, and sportsmanship.

Kids are naturally curious and ask great questions like; why do the leaves change color, or why can't penguins fly? In this class students will get to vote on which experiments they'd like to try as they learn to problem solve through hands-on science experiments and group challenges.
