*There are no after school classes on holidays, no school days, or early dismissal days at the Elementary School. These "No Class" days are figured into the price of each class.

How to Register

All students must turn in, or have on file, a completed E-13 Participant Information and Authorization form to register for class. Once completed, E-13 forms are good for one school year. Though classes are held at the school, <u>all paper work must be turned in to Montlake Community Center</u>, where you can receive more information about classes, registration, and scholarships.

FIRST CHOICE

Check out Seattle Parks and Recreation's new online registration software at bit.ly/spr_registration_account. Sign in or create an account if this is your first time registering for classes with the new software. Once you are logged in you can choose your programs and pay online.

SECOND CHOICE

Find your local recreation center at: seattle.gov/parks/centers.asp and stop by to register for programs and meet the staff. Take a peek at the recreation center and the program space. Staff welcomes face-to-face interaction! Please note hours of operation, as they vary across recreation centers.

THIRD CHOICE

Call your local recreation center during their hours of operation at the phone number listed at: seattle.gov/ parks/centers.asp. All staff can assist you with registration during their operating hours listed on their home page linked from the above web address.

An additional \$5 insurance fee will be required when registering for all gymnastics, tumbling, or circus arts classes offered through Seattle Parks and Recreation. This non-refundable fee covers a child's participation in all gymnastics, tumbling, or circus arts classes for one year from the date of purchase. Please contact your local community center to purchase this insurance. **Note:** This insurance will only be utilized if expenses exceed your primary insurance coverage.

What You Need to Know

Registration and Payments:

Seattle Parks and Recreation launched new program Registration Software this winter.

If you do not already have an account, follow the steps below to set up an account:

- Step 1: Go to the www.seattle.gov/parks and click on Sign Up for Classes and Programs
- Step 2: Click on 'Create Account'.
- Step 3: Complete your information!

If you have any questions about creating a new account, please reach out to your local Community Center directly. Once you have an account, you may call Montlake Community Center, stop by, or register and pay online. If you register online, please email the community center coordinator who your child's classroom teacher is and where your child will be going after class. Registration is open for all classes until the day prior to the start of class. Remember: All students need a Participant Information and Authorization E-13 form prior to participating in any after-school classes.

Scholarship:

To apply for a scholarship, complete and return a scholarship application to the community center. Applications can be found in the **TOPS K-8** main office, **Montlake CC**, or can be downloaded at <u>bit.ly/</u><u>sprscholarships</u>. Scholarship award and co-payment will be determined based on income qualification and fund availability.

Refund Policy:

It is the policy of Seattle Parks and Recreation and the Associated Recreation Council that:

- Anyone who registers for a class that is cancelled for any reason will receive a full refund.
- DROPPING A PROGRAM BEFORE THE SECOND SESSION: A participant may be issued a refund if he/ she withdraws from a program, and notifies the program coordinator, prior to the second class session. The facility will retain the pro-rated class fee plus a service charge of 10% of the fee.
- DROPPING A PROGRAM AFTER THE SECOND SESSION: If a participant withdraws from a program after the second session of a series, no refund will be given.
- CANCELLATION OF ONE SESSION: In the event of an unplanned cancellation of a single session, that class will be rescheduled, and If it cannot be rescheduled, the participant will receive a refund.

OH NO! My class got cancelled!

Most classes require a minimum of 6 participants in order to be financially sustainable. We do our best to avoid cancelling classes. However, classes that do not meet minimum enrollment requirement are cancelled prior to their start date. We do prorate class fees to reflect late registration for classes that meet minimum enrollment requirement prior to their start dates. **PLEASE REGISTER EARLY!**

Snack and Clothing:

The After School Enrichment Program will provide a snack for each student. Please send your children with clothing appropriate for their classes.

Behavior:

We have the expectation of respect for teachers/ instructors and good behavior during classes. Students are expected to maintain the same behavioral standards that they would during the formal school day. If an instructor determines this is not the case the following steps will be taken:

- At the first incident, the Program Administrator will contact parents/guardians regarding student behavior.
- The student will be given one trial class to improve.
- If the disruptive behavior continues, the student will be removed from class.

The program is unable to issue a refund if the student is removed from a class due to a behavioral issue. Please discuss enrollment with your child to be sure they want to attend an after school class.

Picking up Your Child:

Your child must be picked up on time. Our program does not provide childcare after class is over and the playground is not supervised at that time. If your child is picked up late, you will be charged \$1/minute for every minute past your pick up time that you are late. Please call the **Program Administrator** if you are going to be late. Your student can only be picked up by persons listed on the E-13 form.

Absences/Changes:

Please contact the **Program Administrator** as soon as possible with any of the following:

- 1. Your student will not be attending class (but was at school).
- 2. Your student was absent from school and will not be attending the After School Program.

Spring 2019 Class Descriptions A-Z

American Sign Language

Our goal is not to just teach kids vocabulary, but cultural sensitivity and the importance of making communication accessible to people of all abilities. We cover basic grammar, various storytelling styles, ASL games, cultural history and etiquette.

Beginning Guitar

Join us for a beginner's guitar class with Ms. Natalie where we'll learn basic chords in "home position." Students will learn to play multiple songs in full by end of the session. Players from previous sessions are welcome. Guitar provided, but students can bring their own.

Cardio Time! NEW — for adults and children

NEW! This 5 p.m. cardio class is for your child, you, and the grandparents too. Participants get the chance to burn off some energy before heading home. Taught by Daisy Lukas, this class will get your heart pumping and your body moving!

Carpentry

Kids Carpentry is a hands-on toy building class designed to teach practical woodworking skills with an emphasis on the safe use of tools. Kids will develop a repertoire of practical skills that last a lifetime and construct fun projects that they will take home!

Chess Club

This class will improve your child's problem-solving skills, train their memory and teach them to think and plan ahead. They will learn chess tactics and solve puzzles while playing competitive and just-forfun games! Workbooks and other teaching materials provided.

Chorus

Circus Arts

Circus Arts is a great way for your child to have some fun while burning off some energy after school. Comic Book Writing

Step into the world of fantasy and superheroes! In this class students explore the craft of comic book writing, imaginative drawing, story-telling, and creative art. No experience necessary. At the end of the quarter, each student will have their very own #1 comic issue. Taught by cartoonist Mox Stoermer.

Cooking at TOPS

Art is about discovery! Students use a variety of artistic mediums to learn to express themselves creatively and confidently in this supportive, noncompetitive class. The structured format ensures skill development as they journey down the road of self-discovery through creative expression.

Students play Dungeons and Dragons as they set off on an adventure armed with nothing but a pencil, a notebook and a set of shiny dice!

Eco Arts and Crafts

Recycling has never been so fun! Turn clean recyclables into beautiful works of art! Students learn just how satisfying it can feel to repurpose unwanted materials into useful items for the home in this DIY, environmentally friendly, crafting class.

Garden Science

Spring 2019 Class Descriptions A-Z

Gym Games

Sprout ball, battleship, and color squad are a few of the games we will be using to teach the importance of physical activity and teamwork. This class will also provide your child with the opportunity to organize and lead a gym game of their own!

Intermediate World Music Drumming

For students who have already taken the beginning class and have learned various African and Latin drumming rhythms. Students will continue to build on rhythms and techniques of African and Latin drumming while exploring the culture and customs from which the rhythms originated. Taught by Larry Jones.

Jewelry Making

Born to bling! This fun DIY class will teach students the basics of making simple earrings, stringing beads for bracelets and necklaces, making pendants, and crimping beads to finish off their custom designs.

Legos Engineering: Ticket to Ride

Delve into the history and mechanics of favorite amusement park rides in this imaginative unit! Students will construct a Carousel Swing, Tilt a Whirl, giving students an understanding of the physical forces they experience every day..

Magic: The Gathering

Magic: The Gathering will help improve your child's math and logic skills through the strategic playing of cards with different abilities. New and experienced players welcome. Bring your own deck or we can provide you with one to use.

Make with Code

Students program a Micro:bit computer chip using drag and drop coding to create a thermometer, accelerometer, pedometer, compass, light sensor and remote control all in one chip! This innovative class teaches the awesome combination of hands on physical computing and software coding. Taught by Computing Kids.

Minecrafting EDU

Use of an educational version of Minecraft will allow your child to create a networked world. Each week there is a new demonstration such as redstone, programmable turtles, or an interesting build. Exploration is encouraged and fostered depending on experience and interest.

Origami

Explore the ancient art of Origami! Your child will learn a variety of techniques as they transform flat sheets of paper into a finished sculpture through folding. Origami is fun and great for developing small motor skills and learning how to follow instructions.

Pinnacle Outdoors

Does your child have a passion for the outdoors? With a focus on hands-on learning, participants will conduct interactive experiments, make crafts, and go on field trips. Weather permitting, class will be outdoors.

Pottery

This class gives students an opportunity to build clay crafting skills. Students will work with their hands, tools and the pottery wheel. Taught by Suzanne Wakefield, TOPS Art teacher.

Reading Club

Jump into the world of literature with this brandnew club! Younger readers will have a chance to develop their reading skills with age appropriate books and instructor assistance. Older students can complete their reading time before they get home.

Recess/Homework Club

From 4:45-5:30 p.m., M/T/Th and 3:30-5:30 p.m. on Wed, students will tackle their homework. If beautiful outside, kids may go out to the playground with the instructor.

Robot U's RC Power Functions

Students learn advanced engineering concepts (torque, gearing, levers, etc.) building remote controlled vehicles and contraptions using various LEGO® motors and Technic® parts. This is NOT a free play activity, but a class with actual lessons (regardless of how fun and crazy it is).

ACTIVITY BUS

MONDAYS THROUGH THURSDAYS

TOPS has a (free) activity bus that leaves TOPS at 4:45 pm Mondays through Thursdays, starting in mid-October, for families living east or south of TOPS. First preference goes to middle school students, but if there is extra room, younger students are able to utilize the bus as well. Please submit the below form, complete with signature, to the TOPS office as soon as possible. It can take 1-2 weeks for transportation to process requests. <u>Please make sure you have confirmation that your child/ren can ride the bus</u>. Margo Robb, the TOPS Enrichment Program Coordinator, will be in touch with you about eligibility and details. For questions, email her at <u>Margo.Robb@seattle.gov</u>.

Please note that the bus covers a lot of territory and can take a long time. It can be challenging for younger riders.

This is the protocol that buses drivers follow for younger riders:

- Elementary age students are welcomed to ride. The same rules apply to ASAs (After School Activity Buses) as with to and from Transportation.
- K-12 general education students are allowed to get off the without someone there to meet them.
- Stop assignments would follow service standards K-5 grade students with stops not causing them to cross major or minor arterial streets. And 6-8 grade students able to cross at controlled intersections.
- If a student, of any age, is uncomfortable getting off the bus, the drivers are to keep them on the bus and contact their dispatcher. Our office would then be contacted and we would do our best to make contact with a parent or guardian to have them come meet their student.
- Boundaries for bussing are greater than what is used for "to and from" transportation, but anything outside the transportation zone will be decided on by the Transportation Office on a case-by-case basis.
